





Socially constructed norms on how someone should behave

It's okay to be confused.

It's NOT okay to treat someone poorly because of your differences in understanding.

Different Types of Gender

Cisgender

Their gender matches their sex

Transgender

Someone who has switched from the gender identity that matches their sex

Gender Fluid

Someone who goes back & forth between their gender expressions

Non-Binary Intersex

Someone whose gender expression doesn't traditional fit Male or Female categories

Someone who was born with a combination of male/female body parts/genes

Gender Norms

Expected behaviors & roles that society expects a man or a woman to exhibit.





This "holiday" symbolizes how much more a woman would need to work into the next year in order to make as much money as a man did in the previous year.




How Many Days it Takes to Earn
