

#### Material Culture:


- Fashion (Bell Bottoms, Ponchos, Non-traditional clothing bright & colorful)
- Music (The Beatles, The Doors, Woodstock)
- Movies (Easy Rider, Yellow Submarine)

#### Non-Material Culture:

- Values (Love, Creativity, Freedom, "Natural")
- Behaviors (Concerts, Dropping Out, Love-Ins. Demonstrations, Illegal drug use)
- Internal Diversity (Some were in it for spiritual reasons others for political reasons, others for fashion reasons. others for drug reasons)

#### Cultural Relativity:

- They were viewed as a counterculture to mainstream American values at the time
- Out-group in some aspects (legally, politically), in-group in others (culturally, academically)



**Hippies** 

(things you could include)

Origin: Grew out of the Beat Generation in San Francisco, California.

How did it spread (material culture & nonmaterial):

- Movies (Easy Rider, Yellow Submarine)
- Music (The Beatles, The Doors, Woodstock)
- Fashion (Bell Bottoms, Ponchos, Nontraditional clothing, bright & colorful)
- College Campuses (Lectures, Anti-War Protests Parties)
- Books (Doors of Perception, Electric Kool Aid Acid Test, On the Road Again)
