Religious Studies is NOT about evaluating which perspective is "true".




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

recent media coverage of Donald Trump's Bible photo-op in front of St. John's Church, reporters have taken the opportunity to discuss how American Christians have responded to the photo-op itself and the protests in response to the police killing George Floyd in custody. In some cases, reports and interviews have included attention to the history of racism in American Christianity. hese readings provide clear examples of the internal diversity of American Christians' responses, and on a deeper level, these adings also reveal how deeply embedded Christianity is in American culture. Now that you are familiar with taking a nondevotic pproach to religion. I offer these readings not to endorse any position they include, but to demonstrate some of the ways in which ve can ask and answer the religion question in our current moment. Before reading a few of these articles, reflect on how you would expect American Christians to respond to the protests of George Floyd's death. Why do you think they would react that way?

CHRISTIANS' RESPONSES TO DONALD TRUMP AND THE GEORGE FLOYD PROTESTS

Diversity in Christianity. Please make sure to proof-read before submitting your Discussion Post and include the name of the article at the top of your response. Write this in a different app before pasting it into the discussion

- 1) What do the people interviewed in your article have in common regarding how they represent their religion? Why might the reporter(s) choose them to be a representative of Christianity? Whose voices are left out of your article?
- 2) Now analyze why the Christians quoted in your article might take that position. What rationale do they offer? How does the reporter explain it? What else do you know about Christianity in the United States (remember your situated perspective) that might be relevant to understanding their position?
- 3) You may notice that many of these articles focus on white evangelicals, despite the racial diversity of American Christianity. What justification do the articles themselves offer for this choice? What other aspects of American politics and culture do you think feed into it? What is gained or lost from this perspective?
